


This year, we devote this yearbook to the new image of our school, and the implications that it holds.



How to Raise SAT Scores

PERSONALS

The question is frequently asked: What can I do about raising my SAT scores or about making them better than they would be otherwise? The answer is: Quickly and immediately probably not much; over longer periods it depends upon how much time, effort, and concentration goes into the preparation.

The Scholastic Aptitude Test measures the extent to which your reasoning ability and skills with words and mathematical concepts have been developed up to the time you take the test. These abilities are related to academic success in college and one's growth over a lifetime through learning experiences such as those in the family, in school, with your friends and associates, and in reading and independent study. The best preparation for the SAT is to have had varied opportunities of this kind and to have made the most of them.

The skills and abilities the SAT tests tend to grow relatively slow and at different rates for different people. Whether you have more or less of these abilities does not say anything about your worth as an individual. Many other individual qualities not measured by the SAT, such as motivation, creativity, and artistic skills, have much to do with your sense of satisfaction and your success in life.

If you or your parents have been thinking about special

The 14 Kt. Elite has launched a long-term project to improve our image and is already seeing positive results.










BAND
