My association with the staff and fellow students has given me a total and unique perspective of the dynamics of the high school.

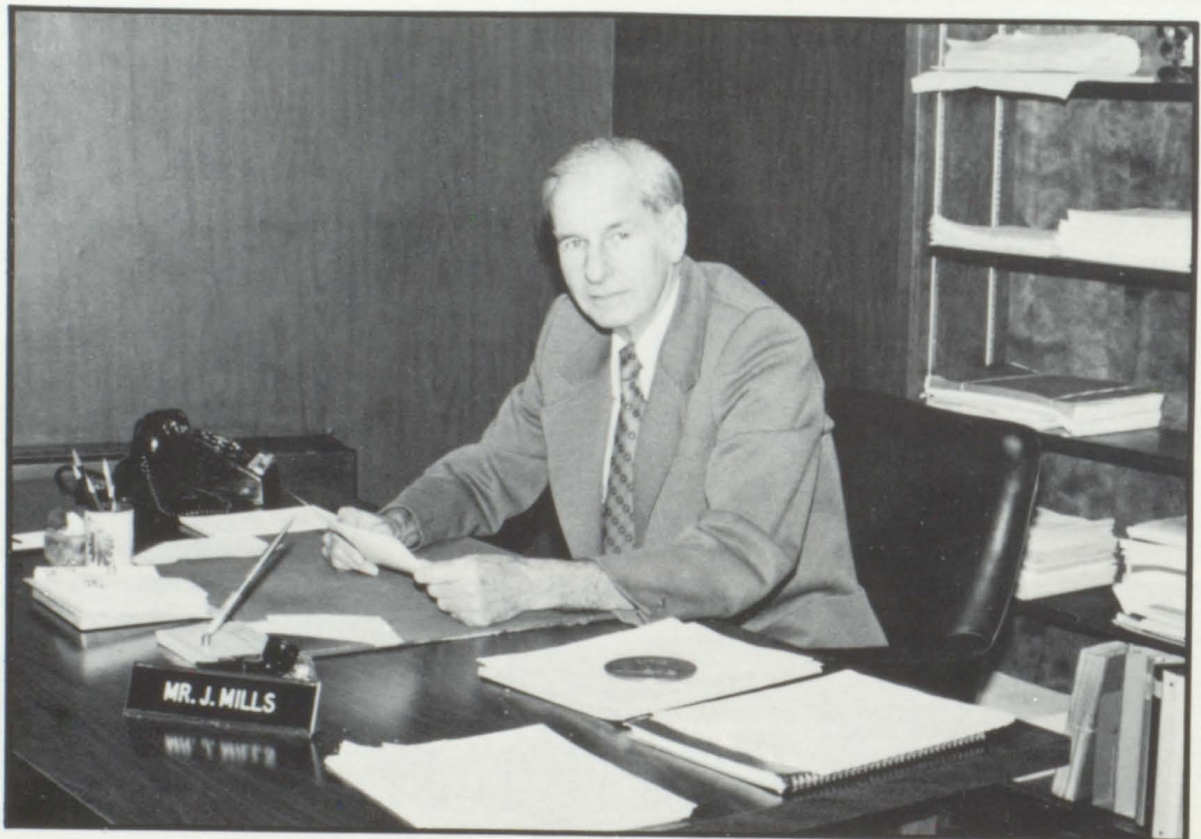
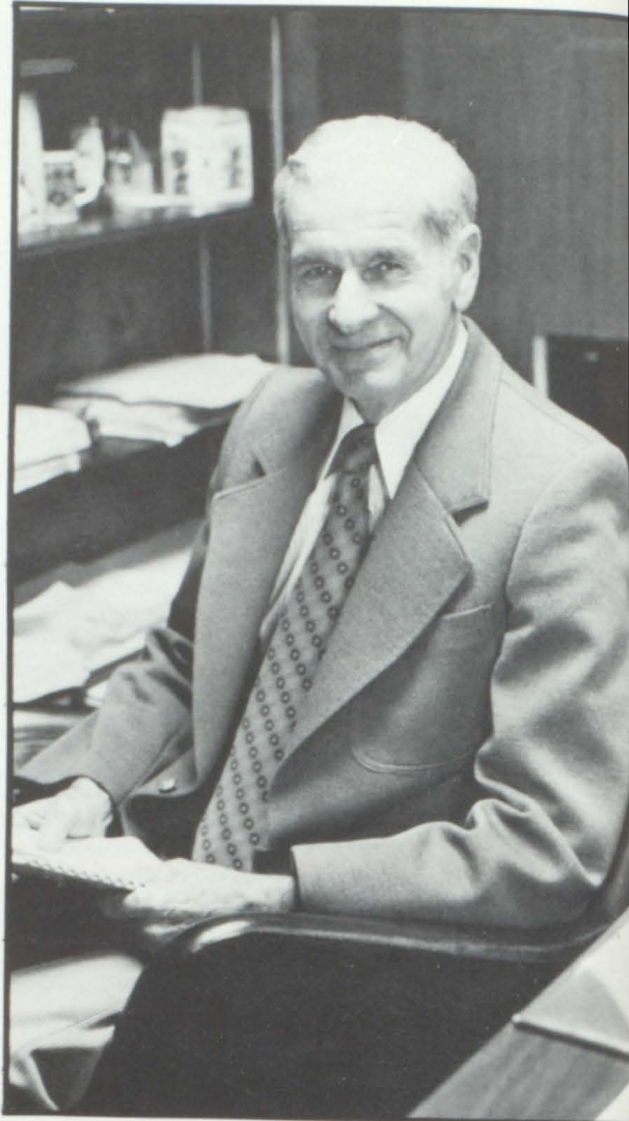
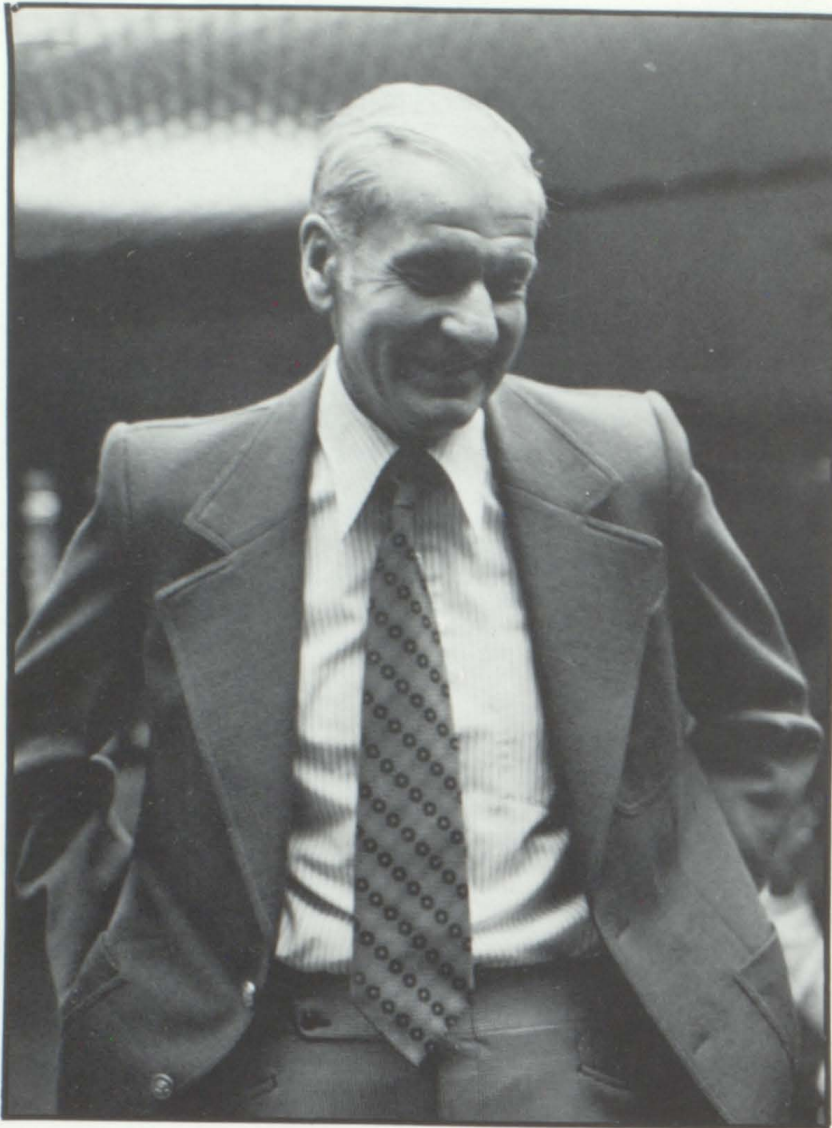
In fulfilling my responsibilities, I have had the pleasure of working with individuals of great character. As a result, many special relationships have developed that are irreplaceable within my heart.

All in God's eyes no better than me."

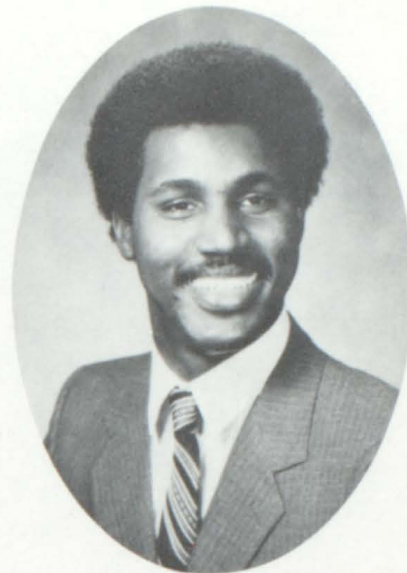
So as you take your first steps in life, remember that no matter how much you are put down by others, the persons who will judge you see themselves in you.

Small stores were looted, houses were broken into and many evening businesses had to close down because of this one little disaster - the blackout!

Recently, on October 24, 1981 a blackout occurred in the Hempstead/Uniondale area. That evening a storm was in process. This storm continued throughout the night. The storm was so severe, that the electrical wires were affected by it. The lights went out in the mid-morning hours. The electricity failed causing anything that worked with electricity to fail. Many people were unaware that there was a blackout. Fortunately enough, this was not a major blackout.

The problem of disasters in general is that disasters cause many other problems. How well is the world prepared for disasters? How well is Hempstead prepared for disasters? These questions should not do unattended. Think about the seriousness of this matter. Disasters are a major concern and should be regarded as such.

Atlanta represent much more than a local tragedy and a frustrating police puzzle. Since July 1979, black children of Atlanta have been stalked by a murderer or murderers. In the past two years there have been few clues to who's responsible.

A vast variety of questions have arisen. Who's responsible for the slaying of Wayne B. Williams, a 23 year old black man who is awaiting trial for 2 of the slayings? No. He is alleged murderer of only one child out of 28. Therefore, the murderer or murderers of the other 27 children are unaccounted for.

Since Williams was arrested and locked up in the Fulton County Jail to await trial, it has been widely perceived that the case has been solved. Is the green ribbon over? Will the children of Atlanta still have an 11 o'clock curfew? While the families in Atlanta gathered around the television watching "Different Strokes" will they shiver when the announcer says, "Do you know where your children are?"

Illiteracy Cure Fund

The Lola T. Martin Scholarship Fund Inc. is a not for profit Center for service to Hempstead and other communities. It is organized on the basis of a private exempt, 501-C3 organization.

The Fund was founded in 1974. Its purpose is to grant scholarships to "C" average students in extra boost to start college or other institution of higher education. Here stems the purpose of the Fund. The students may apply for the scholarship through the Guidance Counselor. The criteria is as follows:

1. Demonstrate leadership potential
2. Civic Minded
3. "C" Average (between 70-80 average)

While others are not precluded, special attention will be given to the academically deprived, regardless of race, color, creed or sex.

The goal of this fund is to build a foundation to uplift and encourage youth to persevere and obtain a college education regardless of the obstacles they must overcome. The students who are chosen will be awarded, Lola T.

Martin Scholarships of \$1000, \$500, \$250, \$200 and stipends of \$100 for the first year of college.

Decisions of the Scholarship Committee will be final. Applications must be received by the last day of February.

Other Programs:

- Reading is Fundamental: Free distribution of books to school aged students 3 times annually. (RIP partially funded by Federal Government.)
- The Laubach Way To Reading (Free Tutoring) to Adults and Students on an "Each One Teach One" basis. Remedial reading.
- Publisher of "GRASS ROOT SPEAK" magazine, Supplement to "FOLK GALLERY"

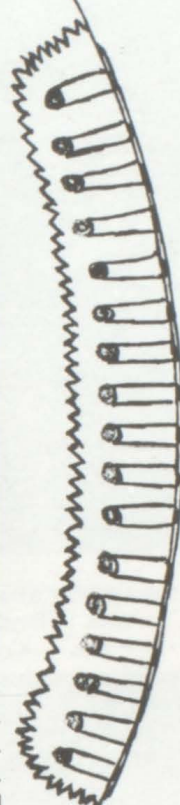

Careers are a part of our way of life and helps us to choose one of our basic goals. The high school provides expanded opportunities in career awareness through the cooperative education program.

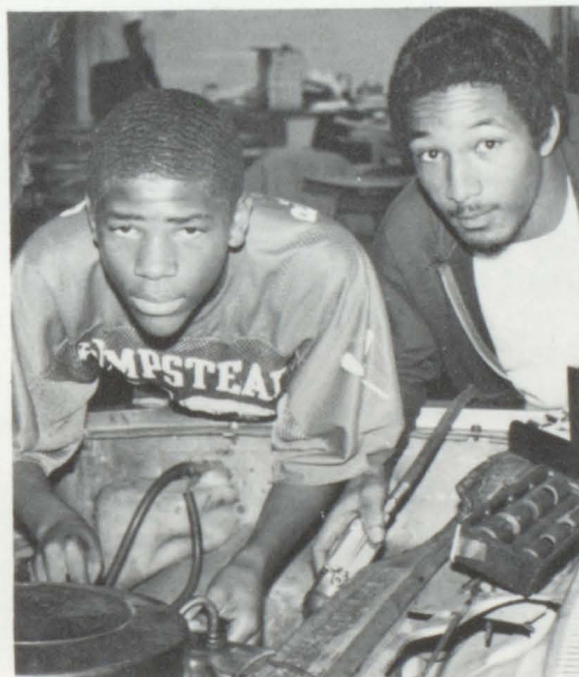
In this program, students divide their day between classroom instruction and practical experiences in courses such as child developing, printing, auto mechanics, and food service.
